



These pictures show a patient with chlamydial conjunctivitis. The signs are pretty minimal, consistent with any conjunctivitis, however the patient's history prompted investigation. The patient complained of a unilateral red eye with no watering and little mucus for 2 weeks with no change in symptoms. As this is unusual (most conjunctivitis improves over 7-10 days) a chlamydial APTIMA swab confirmed the diagnosis. The patient was asymptomatic from genital chlamydia and reported no new or high-risk sexual contacts.
