Some important words to understand and remember





Your body is made of small parts called cells. Sometimes the cells go wrong. This may be cancer.



Lots of people are cured of cancer, especially if it is found early.







Cervix

We will talk about your cervix. The cervix is inside your body at the top of your vagina. You cannot see it.

Vagina

People use different words for their vagina like:

front bottom flower

down below fanny

private parts foof

In this presentation, we say vagina.

Cervical cancer

A cancer in your cervix.

Smear test

Cervical Screening is sometimes called a smear test.

A smear test looks for changes to the cells of your cervix. It is not a test for cancer. Finding changes before they turn into cancer can help stop cervical cancer.










When you have a screening test, your nurse needs to see your cervix. They use a speculum made of plastic to gently open your vagina.



When you have a smear test, your doctor or nurse uses a small brush to take cells from your cervix.





Why is it important to have a cervical screening test?



Having a screening test saves 5000 women's lives every year. It could save your life.





I need a cervical screening test if I am....



A woman





I need a cervical screening test if I am....





I am having or have had sex with a man or a woman or have had sexual touching





I need a cervical screening test if I am....



I am over 25. If you are aged 25 to 49, you can have a smear test every 3 years. If you are aged 50 or older, you can have a smear test every 5 years.





Where do I have a cervical smear test?



Your doctor should send a letter asking you to book a smear test. If they do not send a letter, ask them for a smear test.



Appointments are usually booked with a nurse. You can take a friend with you if you would like.







Your doctor has also asked us to contact you to book you a smear test either at your own practice or with one of our friendly nurses close to where you live.



You should book a date when you are not on your period.





What happens when I have a cervical smear?





You will be asked to get undressed from the waist down including underwear.

When you are comfortable, the nurse will position you correctly and will ask you to open your legs so that they can put an object called a speculum inside your vagina and will use a small brush to take a sample of cells from your cervix.









The test can be slightly uncomfortable but should not hurt. If it hurts tell the nurse to stop.



This actual procedure is very quick and should only take 5 minutes.
