A GP's guide to Badger Notes

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What is Badger Notes?

Your local secondary care maternity provider is using an electronic hand-held record to allow pregnant women/people to access their maternity records via a mobile app or via the web. This replaces the previous paper versions of pregnancy records. The electronic hand-held record is called Badger Notes and links directly to the woman/pregnant person's electronic medical record in the hospital.

What is the rationale for 'Badger Notes - GP Access'?

We understand that if you see a patient during their pregnancy, you require relevant medical information about their pregnancy at your fingertips. In the past, a woman/pregnant person might have presented you with their paper record to read. Badger Notes GP Access allows you to access this vital data via a secure web portal. To ensure seamless care along the pregnancy journey, Badger Notes GP Access also allows you to document your consultation in a way that feeds directly back into the electronic medical record in the hospital.

How does it work?

This feature is designed to be used during a GP consultation.

The woman/pregnant person clicks [Share Access](#) from the Profile Settings Menu in the mobile app or at www.pregnotes.net.

**Security Information**

We will never send you an email asking for confidential or personal information, such as your password. Please do not respond to any emails requesting access to your personal information. Our messages and attachments are checked for computer viruses but we cannot guarantee this and do not accept any liability for loss or damage that may be caused.

- The patient will ask you for your work email address to set up access. They will be asked to agree that they will not use this email address for any other purpose.
- The patient will give you a unique security phrase which is case sensitive.
- You will receive an email from Patient.Portal@nhs.net
- Click on the link contained in the email – this directs you to a secure web portal where you will have access to the patient's record for **one hour** from the time they share the record.
- Register/sign in to view the record using your email address and the unique security phrase given to you by the patient.
