We would like to bring to your attention the following new pages which have been added to Remedy in the last month:

- <u>Coronary Artery Calcification</u> information and the referral pathway has been agreed with cardiologists at NBT and UHBW.
- <u>HOPE programme</u> the HOPE programme offers facilitated or self-directed digital courses for people with long term conditions or carers. Internet access is required. Patients can self refer and we have added details to the Self Care section.
- <u>Self Harm in Children & Young people</u> this page provides links to various resources for health professionals working with children and young people presenting with self harm.
- <u>Infection Sciences Test Sample Quick Guide</u> the Infection sciences lab at NBT have provided this quick guide for various test samples.
- <u>Accurx templates for CYP</u> links to CYP accurx templates for common CYP presentations which can be shared with patients and families.
- <u>Diagnostic Tests locations available</u> this document shows which tests are available at which sites when referred to NBT or UHBW.

- Mpox the latest information regarding suspected Mpox has been added.
- <u>Direct Access Radiology</u> some practices referring to NBT will now have patients booked to the CDC at Cribbs Causeway. For these practices, patients will be contacts by the CDC to arrange an appointment. Patients at all other practices will still need to contact NBT for an appointment. - <u>Acne vulgaris</u> guidelines and resources have been updated in connection with prescribing Isotretinoin
- Gender Incongruence in children and young people the Gender Identity page has been updated and the name changed to Gender Incongruence in line with the new service. GPs can no longer refer directly to the waiting list but need to refer via mental health services of general paediatrics. See the page for more details.
- Sacral dimples and pits guidance on ultrasound timescales has been updated.
- Infant feeding support the Breastfeeding support page has been updated and renamed.
